Missions ~LAMP LIGHTERS WORLD MINISTRIES The small rural town of Roseville reaches out to the far edges of the world, to places most of us will never go. One of those places is Sri Lanka through the mission of Lamp Lighters World Ministries. Steve Bycroft, who grew up in this church, and who was the Faith Promise speaker in 2024, is the head of that ministry. Sri Lanka has a government that is against the Christian gospel, yet the people there need to hear that message of eternal hope. Steve sends us a newsletter each month. Look at the bulletin board in the Fellowship Hall to see what is happening. The country's economy is unstable with a continuous increase of costs and shortages as well as violence. Through our support, they have been able to purchase land to build a church in Portivu, which is a huge step forward. A Youth Camp is planned for next month. Small groups and house services are meeting for worship in four locations. Steve who now lives in Joplin Missouri, spent many years in Sri Lanka with his wife Shanti. When they returned to the US, his children were refused entry. Two of his daughters in Sri Lanka plan to marry in August. He is returning for the weddings. We support this mission with our Faith Promise funds, but please actively support Lamp Lighters in prayer. Pray for the plans and execution of the Youth Camp. Pray for cooperation among church workers. Pray that the plans for the new building at Portivu will be approved and progress will go well. Pray that new churches will start in other areas. Pray for a preacher for the Periya Neelavanai ministry. Pray for the worshippers that their faith may grow despite discouragement from the government. Pray for Steve's plans to visit his family and to provide encouragement to the churches to go smoothly.


